

Age Averaging for Duel in the Desert 2011 explained

Age averaging for OC-6

Add up the ages of all 6 paddlers on your crew. That's it! (remember, you're all one year older than last year when we did this)

As per CORA rules, your age has to be your age as of December 31 of this year.

Here's the breakdown of total ages for each division:

Junior	n/a
Open	108 to 239 years
Master	240 to 299 years
Senior Master	300 to 359 years
Golden Master	360 to 389 years
Kupuna	390 to 1,000 years

PRCC's Duel in the Desert race will allow age-averaged teams to compete in their calculated divisions as it applies to standings in the PRCC race. All crews, age-averaged or otherwise, will be eligible for prizes as determined by PRCC officials.

CORA Cup Points

The CORA Cup Points series does not allow for age averaging to contribute to your club's point total (yet) . So teams that are using age averaging will be asked to identify which age category they would have registered in based on the age of their youngest paddler.

Race organizers reserve the right to amend the rules at their discretion and without notice. We're just trying something that we hope will make it more fair and more fun for everybody.
